**DATE OF MEETING:** August 20, 2008

**AGENDA ITEM:** Final approval of the "first wave" of gaming regulations

**PRESENTER**: Patrick D. Martin, Assistant Attorney General

**ISSUE SUMMARY:** Staff asks the Commission to formally and finally approve five articles of regulations. Those regulations relate to (1) General provisions and definitions, (2) Minimum Internal Control Standards, (3) Security, (4) Surveillance, and (5) Responsible Gaming. The Commission's formal approval is statutorily required before the regulations can be published in the Kansas Register as permanent regulations.

The regulations are necessary to uphold the integrity of gaming in Kansas. Under Senate Bill 66, the Commission is generally responsible for creating and adopting "such rules and regulations as the commission deems necessary to carry out the duties and functions of the commission pursuant to Kansas expanded lottery act." 2007 SB66 § 41. Additionally, the Commission is specifically responsible for adopting regulations "[p]romoting the integrity of the gaming and finances of lottery gaming facilities and racetrack gaming facilities and [the Commission] shall meet or exceed industry standards for monitoring and controlling the gaming and finances of lottery gaming facility operations and racetrack gaming facility operations and shall give the Kansas racing and gaming commission sufficient authority to monitor and control the gaming operation and to ensure its integrity and security." *Id.* at (a). Each of these regulations is crucial to meeting that responsibility.

The regulations have followed the rigorous process involved in creating permanent regulations. Over the last 9 months, these regulations have been reviewed by the KRGC (and its consultants), the Department of Administration, the Attorney General's office, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and Regulations, and members of the regulated community. Suggested revisions from each entity have been adopted into the current set of regulations.

**COMMISSION ACTION REQUIRED/REQUESTED**: Staff asks the Commission to conduct a **roll call vote** to approve the five articles.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:** Staff recommends approval of the regulations.

completion of background investigations required by KELA

**PRESENTER**: Stephen Martino, Executive Director

**ISSUE SUMMARY:** The Expanded Lottery Act gives the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission 10 days to approve in whole or reject in whole the recommendation of the lottery gaming facility review board. *See* K.S.A. 74-8736(e). That 10-day period will commence soon for all zones as the Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board is scheduled to vote on proposals for all zones and their statutorily allowed deadlines will expire by the end of September.

In order to properly complete background investigations, the Racing and Gaming Commission will need more time. Kansas Expanded Lottery Act (KELA) allows the Commission to receive a 60-day extension from the governor. The Lottery Commission earlier sought and received a 60-day extension to negotiate contracts with prospective managers in each zone, and the Lottery Gaming Facility Review Board requested and received a 60-day extension to find the "best possible contract."

**COMMISSION ACTION REQUIRED/REQUESTED:** Authorize the executive director to request 60-day extensions for the southeast, south central, southwest and northeast gaming zones from the governor in accordance with K.S.A. 74-8736(f), in order to complete background investigations required by the KELA.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION:** Staff recommends authorization of the request.
